



CLARE CITY POLICE Monthly Report DECEMBER 2009



STATISTICS:

This month we had over 256 events of activity. 207 of them were incidents, 11 were arrests, 15 of the incidents were traffic crashes, and 23 total tickets were issued. Twelve of these tickets were parking tickets for 3a-6a violations. Our highest category was for calls to investigate suspicious situations / persons. The next highest category was to respond to alarms.

We had more larceny and prowler complaints than normal this month. Our staff has solved several of these larceny offenses already and we are working on something to put an end to the prowler complaints in the area of Hemlock / Orchard.

COMPLAINTS:

This month we have had less calls for service this month compared to this same time last year. We also had less arrests this month compared to this same time last year.

TRAINING:

This month our staff had defensive tactics training.

AUXILIARY DIVISION:

Our Auxiliary / Cadets have worked over 150 hours this month. They worked their normal shifts and helped welcome Santa to Clare. We have three very seasoned auxiliary officers that have contacted us recently and want to rejoin the department. We are also exploring taking on a few more really qualified candidates, but we won't have a definite amount of staff coming on board until the others are interviewed and backgrounds are conducted.
