### Monthly Report

#### JANUARY 2010



#### STATISTICS:

This month we had over 220 events of activity. 155 of them were incidents, 20 were arrests, 9 of the incidents were traffic crashes, and 45 total tickets were issued. Three of these tickets were parking tickets for 3a-6a violations. Our highest category was for calls to investigate suspicious situations / persons. The next highest category was to assist MMR and our citizens on medical calls.

#### COMPLAINTS:

We had more larcenies, warrant arrests, false alarms, more suspicious persons / situations, drunk driving arrests, and disorderly crimes this month than January of 2009. Most of our other complaints are down. We had a huge break in our prowler in the area of Hemlock / Orchard. Our staff did surveillance, located the suspect, ended up in a brief foot chase, and were able to apprehend the suspect safely. He has since been charged and arraigned in 80<sup>th</sup> District Court. He will no longer harass our citizens living in that area of town.

We had less arrests this month than we did this same time last year.

#### TRAINING:

This month our staff had defensive tactics training.

#### AUXILIARY DIVISION:

Our Auxiliary / Cadets have worked over 140 hours this month. They worked their normal shifts and helped with New Years Eve. They are planning for our Business Expo, Neighborhood Watch, and our Irish Festival. We also have had three very seasoned auxiliary officers return to the department. They are Steve Lynch, Monty Vancise, and Elton Petoskey. We also added city residents Ken Chinavare and James Thompson to our department's auxiliary unit. All of these officers will be great additions to the city and our services we provide.
