



## CLARE CITY POLICE Monthly Report JULY 2010



### STATISTICS:

This month we had over 410 events of activity. 344 of them were incidents, 22 were arrests, 21 of the incidents were traffic crashes, and 42 were traffic tickets. Our highest category was 25 calls for suspicious situations and our second highest category was 21 general assistance calls to our citizens and visitors to the city. Of the 344 calls, 15 were disorderly conducts, 11 were warrant arrests, 7 were alarms, 15 were traffic investigations with 12 involving injury, 2 were drunk driving arrests, 5 were suspended drivers, and various other incidents. There was no overtime paid out this month for assists to other agencies.

### COMPLAINTS:

This month we have had more regularly based calls for service and less arrests compared to this same time last year. We had a computer hacking scam group hack into one of our local businesses computers and steal multiple credit card numbers. They then charged up thousands of dollars on to the accounts of the numbers they had stolen. This was done worldwide. We worked with the victims, the United States Secret Service, multiple financial institutions, local retailers, and many other law enforcement agencies to conclude it was a hacking incident. The Secret Service continues to track the investigation and suspects who they believe are in another country.

### TRAINING:

The Auxiliary Division received traffic stop training this month. We have firearms and active school training scheduled for next month.

### PERSONNEL:

We did not add any new members to our team this month.

We lost part time Officers James Wren and Paul Morningstar as they took full time jobs as Deputies with the Clare County Sheriff Department.

Our Auxiliary division donated a total of 212 hours this month of which 145 was road patrol time and 67 hours was combined training and meeting time.

### EQUIPMENT:

We have a new light bar order for unit 46-3 that is LED. It was cheaper than buying a motorized rotator and we only have to replace bulbs in the future versus a motor if it were to break.

COMMUNITY RELATIONS / PR ACTIVITIES:

We had the Summerfest Festivities and Fireworks at Shamrock Park again this year. We also incorporated a bike course for the kids to enjoy. The whole weekend was a success with no major complaints or traffic problems.

We had our 2010 Youth Police Academy this past month. We had 20 kids who successfully completed the two week program. They learned about police investigations, courtesy, integrity, professionalism, physical training, crime scene investigations, first aid, traffic crash investigations, canine use in police work, and many other topics of interest. All the children enjoyed the program. We are grateful to our youth, their parents, our city commission, our police and city staff, and our local retailers who donated many products such as food, time, and other materials.

We are now preparing for Labor Day and our kids to go back to school.
